We know it is the right thing to do for the environment and keeping our planet alive a little longer, and perhaps even giving a better world (or at the very least how we found it) to the next generation, and the next, and the next A grand scheme is going on now with the abandoned Vallco Shopping Mall in Cupertino, CA. The defunct mall is being turned into 2 million square feet of office space, 680 market-rate and 120 affordable and senior housing apartments, movie theatres, bowling establishment, ice skating facility and more.
