# GOOD OF THE ORDER

I am not sure if you have seen it or not yet, but the Senate Finance Committee is in the process of marking up the Senate's version of the tax reform legislation to rewrite our nation's tax code. Modest improvements were made to protect the Nation's current Historic Tax Credit, but not in full as it stands now. Currently, exclusion of lower small business tax rates (affecting a multitude of small architectural firms) and exclusion of the tax deduction for energy efficient commercial buildings (179D) are still part of the new tax laws. I am sure I need not "preach to the choir" on how much this will affect your business. One of the many benefits of AIA is to stay on top of issues such as this and alert our membership in order for our group to contact our Legislators in mass and become part of the larger AIA squeaking wheel. 
